## Tobacco And Smoking Policy

In October 2014, the Brescia University Board of Trustees approved a Smoke-Free Campus policy. In accordance with ordinances enacted by the City of Owensboro, smoking is not allowed on campus or within 25 feet of an entrance to any campus building, including residence halls. This policy includes public sidewalks which may be adjacent to Brescia building entrances.

## How to Move-In

Check-in for Merici/Saffer will be located in front of Merici Hall located at 205 W. 8th Street. Please enter the street from Allen Street, as we will have traffic flowing one way during move-in. You will need to move your vehicle from the street immediately once your items have been unloaded from the vehicle.

## Microwaves

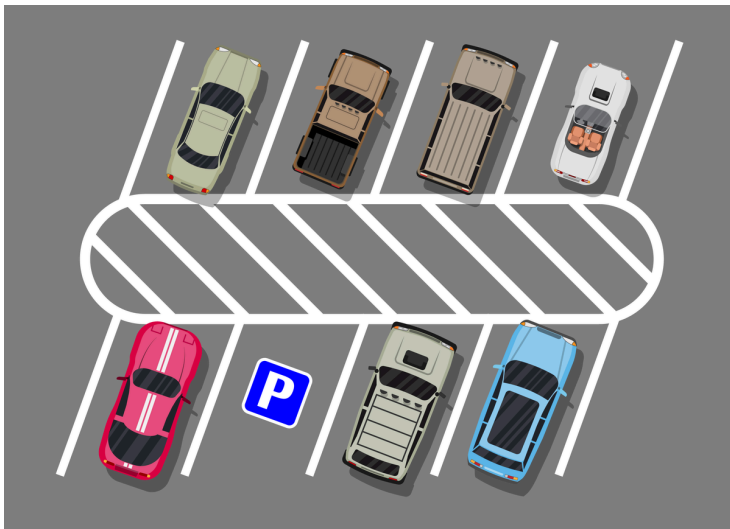


# BRESCIA UNIVERSITY Campus Map

# On-Campus Parking

## Move-In Day Parking

During move-in, you will be allowed to park in any residence hall parking lot, but will need to move your vehicle away from the unloading zone once you are finished. You will **NOT** need to have your permanent parking pass on move-in day.

## Parking Passes

Parking permit may be obtained, free of charge, at the Office of Student Affairs at the start of each semester. Students may park, with a University parking permit, in all campus lots except the faculty lots behind the Science Building and behind the Library. Residents of Merici and Saffer halls are encouraged to park in the lot in front of Merici, off of Ninth Street.

Please be aware that the make & model of each vehicle as well as the license plate # will be needed to obtain a parking pass.

# Important Info

## Safety & Security

Residents are asked to watch out for and protect their “home away from home” and the members of their community. All residence hall exterior doors are only accessible by residents of that building, using their access card.

Allowing someone to enter behind you without a resident escorting them or without using an access card, should be actively discouraged by all residents. Students should lock the door behind them when they go out (even if they just go down the hall) and when they are sleeping. Never loan out your key or access card to someone else.

## Barney See, Barney Do

We ask all of our residents to be part of the Campus wide campaign, “Barney See, Barney Do” to promote bystander awareness and campus safety. This campaign encourages the Brescia Community to contact the Campus Security phone number in the event of an emergency, suspicious activity, or if they are in need of assistance.

## Student of Concern

Brescia University provides an avenue open to all Faculty, Staff, and Students to submit a Student of Concern form that notifies specific offices on campus to assist students needing additional assistance in academics or personal matters. To file a Student of Concern form scan the QR code:



## Laundry

Laundry rooms are available in all residence halls. The washers and dryers are high efficiency (HE) machines, so we recommend bringing HE certified detergent. Laundry is free for all students.

## Furniture

Each residence hall student has an 80” extra-long twin-size bed, drawer space and an area for hanging clothes. Each student will have a desk and chair. All furniture that is provided must stay within the room upon move-in.

## Fees & Payments

Housing and meal plan fees will be placed on the student's university account in August for the fall and in January for the spring.

Your housing and meal plan can be paid for online or in-person with the cashier in the Student Services Building on-campus.

## ID Card

ID Cards are issued at Orientation. ID Cards allow our students to access all buildings on-campus, including our academic buildings. Lost ID cards should be reported immediately. ID cards are replaced for \$25.00 and are made in the Moore Center office of Student Affairs.

## Staffing the Halls

### Director of Residence Life

The Director of Residence Life is a full time professional staff member that supervises the Resident Assistant staff while working with campus partners to provide living learning environments for students.

### Graduate Assistant (GA)

The Graduate Assistant is a graduate student that assists in supervising the Resident Assistant staff as well as working with the department on programming initiatives and serving in on-call rotation to serve the residents.

### Senior Resident Assistants (SRA)

Senior Resident Assistants are returning RAs that provide on-call services to residents, assist in programming for our campus and provide peer to peer learning and accountability for the Resident Assistant staff. SRAs live amongst our community to help provide additional support to our Freshman students.

### Resident Assistants (RA)

Resident Assistants are students that live in amongst the community to assist students with navigating campus life, to handle maintenance concerns, and to provide on-call services for residents. They are trained to build community, to navigate campus, and more!

# Extended Breaks

## Extended Breaks

Residence Halls close for Fall Break, Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, and Spring Break (check the academic calendar for specific dates). During these times, students are expected to leave the campus. Students who must, for appropriate reasons, remain on campus over vacation periods are to make arrangements with the Director of Residence Life. During the closure times there is no food service, no visitation, and no receptionist on duty.

# Getting Connected FAQs

## Student WI-FI Information

Full coverage of outdoor areas on campus and inside most all academic buildings on campus are available for wireless access.

To access Brescia University wireless, you must have a 802.11 a or 802.11b, or 802.11g wireless card. 802.11n is not available at this time.

Your username to login to the wireless network on campus is your Brescia University email address and your password is your Brescia University email password.

If you have issues connecting to the wireless network please visit the helpdesk and submit a ticket.

## What if I'm a Gamer?

Residence Hall Room Ethernet Connections - All residence hall rooms are wired for Ethernet, which requires an Ethernet card to establish a connection. All residence hall rooms are equipped with at least 1 activated port.

- Go to the IT Helpdesk and click submit ticket
- Fill out the request ticket. Be sure to include your name, room number, type of console, and its MAC address.
- Plug the game console into the Ethernet jack in your room using a Cat-5 Ethernet cable.

When you plug the game console into the data jack in your room using a Cat-5 Ethernet cable, the DHCP client on your game console will automatically receive IP address information from the DHCP server.

# Getting Connected FAQs

## Video Game Devices & Other Non Computers

The Brescia University Information Technology Department will assist students with connecting wired entertainment devices which are compatible with the institution's network hardware. Wired entertainment devices are limited to one per wired network connection where connections are available.

The IT department reserves the right to decline setting up any device which may use excessive re-sources or cause interruptions the resources provided. Maintenance requests may be submitted by residents to their RA or to the Director of Residence Life who direct these to the appropriate department. A submitted request gives maintenance staff permission to enter the student's room or apartment for repairs.

## Streaming Devices

Want to stream your favorite TV shows? Have a Netflix series you can't miss? Our IT Department has a way for you to have a pleasant streaming experience.

Wired devices will give a better entertainment experience and are preferred. Wireless devices, such as Roku and Fire TV Sticks can be used if they have captive portal capability, but the experience will be much more pleasant with a wired device (a wired adapter can be purchased for Fire TV sticks for around \$10 - \$15).

IT does assist as much as possible and attempt to find wired adapters for wireless entertainment devices, but we do suggest using the wired connection over a wireless connection for entertainment devices.
